ABOUT TRIENNIUM: Imagine over 6,000 Presbyterian young people from all over the United States, Canada, and around the world, all together singing, laughing, praising God and discovering what it means to be faithful in today's complex world. That's the **Triennium!** This wonderful youth event happens once every three years, and is designed as a growing experience for the heart, mind, and soul of Presbyterian young people **between the ages of 15-19 as of July 1, 2010.**

The theme for the 2010 Triennium is **“For Such a Time as This”** —a powerful cry from the book of Esther. Building on the story of Esther, the theme is an encouragement to be courageous, to be faithful, and to be attentive to God. To listen deeply to God and to respond, with the extraordinary gifts given to young people, to a world in need of Jesus’ story and the gospel messages that inspire us to act.



WORK CREW: Those who are between 19 and 22 years may join the *work crew*. These young people will help the staff, leadership and participants in all areas of programming by performing a variety of tasks such as transporting those with special needs, delivering messages, delivering supplies, assisting the leadership and more. They will have special housing and otherwise participate with the presbytery. The COST for Work Crew is **\$415.**
